

# Vanessa Lail, one of five teachers, to receive \$5,000 from Science Everywhere

for Outside-School Bringing Math and Science to Life

Prizes awarded to innovative elementary, middle, and high school teachers in Florida, South Carolina, North Carolina, Missouri, and Nebraska for inspiring students to learn and love math and science outside the classroom

Science Everywhere Innovation Challenge funded by Overdeck Family Foundation and the Simons Foundation in partnership with Donors Choose.org

Vanessa Lail, media coordinator at Grandview Middle, is one of five teacher winners from across the country who won \$5,000 through Science Everywhere, a nationwide challenge by Overdeck Family Foundation and the Simons Foundation in partnership with DonorsChoose.org. The goal is to bring math and science beyond school walls. Teachers in all 50 states created and implemented exceptional outside-class math and science projects that others can replicate to inspire students and parents to think about these subjects in new ways. Science Everywhere provided half a million dollars in funds to match public donations via DonorsChoose.org, bringing nearly 1,000 projects to life and impacting more than 100,000 students.

### HHS teacher, Lisa Camichos, addresses Greek Symposium in NJ

Lisa Camichos is speaking at the Modern Greek Studies Symposium in New Jersey on November 3. She is the only non-doctoral candidate who was invited to speak. Her topic is the Orlando Plan. "In 1946 my Grandfather received a letter from his brothers who were trapped in Greece during Nazi Occupation.," explains Camichos. "The situation was dire, and they were in need of help. My Grandfather convinced the city of Orlando to adopt Volos, Greece for a three month period in order to raise food, and other needed supplies for the starving peoples of the Pelion region of Greece. Once the Orlando Plan ended, the efforts of the people of Orlando just faded from history. Thankfully, my grandparents did not throw anything away (like most Greeks!) so when my grandfather died, we began to find letters and other documents related to this relief effort. Seven years later, I had my MA thesis," she said.



The Hickory High Marching Tornadoes ended their competitive season on a high note, winning first place in music and percussion at the Foard Band Classic! Additionally, the band placed second overall in Class 3A, earning another rating of "Superior!" **CONGRATS!**
